
We are quickly approaching the King's Coronation where we will be holding a special day in school to mark this momentous occasion.

During the week following the Coronation, there will be various activities taking place. For Year 6 pupils, this will be optional in their daily free time sessions following their SATs tests and revision lessons. These activities include learning the words to God Save the King, making a whole school art display spelling out the words KING CHARLES and taking part in a poster or poem competition based around 'What Britain means to you'.

On **Friday 12th May**, after Year 6 have finished their final SATs exams, we will have an afternoon dedicated to Coronation Celebrations. Please could all children and staff come to school in their own clothes on this day, with a theme of red, white and blue to reflect our nation's patriotic colours **Year 6 must come into school in their uniforms to sit their final exam but should bring a change of clothes with them for afterwards**. We will then have an outdoor garden party, where we will be completing some traditional British games such as welly-wanging, bowls, a treasure hunt, archery and hoopla, followed by a group rendition of the National Anthem and a moment to remember Queen Elizabeth.
