We will be celebrating with fun Maths activities throughout the day, including taking part in in a friendly in-school competition on Times Tables Rock Stars (TTRS) for KS1 and 2 pupils (which can be accessed from home with their individual log-ins). Every minute spent on TTRS and every correct answer to a multiplication or division question will earn your child's class a point. All game modes (Gig, Garage, Studio, etc.) will count but only from games played on Friday 3rd February. Prizes will be given to the highest scoring class in school and the highest scoring pupil in each class!
